(This article was written from St. Simons Island, Georgia, on the afternoon of Inauguration Day.)

Arriving Monday afternoon for this annual continuing education conference, participants were immediately engaged with guest speakers Marcus Borg and Diana Butler Bass. Though almost everything we are seeing and hearing is absorbed with the inauguration of a new president, I am still compelled to join others in stitching together reflections of this milestone.

Three emotional patriotic days for me began as I watched the pre-inaugural HBO event, "We Are One." This celebration took place at the Lincoln Memorial on Sunday afternoon. In the form of a Greek Doric temple, this building has been one of my "thin places" through the years. This architectural memorial is a place where I have repeatedly felt the power of Life under some of Lincoln's words sculpted into the walls that honor the image and person of our sixteenth President. The better part of an hour spent at the top of those steps on July 4, 1976, became an unexpected experience of quiet ecstasy. It demanded of me a reconsideration of life—its value and purpose. No doubt, my experience has been shared by many others.

An outraged Eleanor Roosevelt arranged for African American Marian Anderson to sing from those steps at the feet of Lincoln's image on an Easter morning in 1939 after being barred from singing in Washington's Constitutional Hall. Among her selection of songs was "My Country 'Tis of Thee," which was repeated last Sunday by another African American, Renee Fleming.

The Irish rock band, U2, sang "Pride (In the Name of Love)" written by bandleader Bono. "I Have a Dream," delivered from those same steps in 1963 by The Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., provided the inspiration for Bono's composition.

Monday night's St. Simons' session closed with a brief service in memory of Dr. King on the anniversary of his birthday. Among the songs we sang were "If I Had a Hammer" and "We Shall Overcome"—songs also sung from those steps in 1963. The "hammer of justice, the bell of freedom, and the song about the love between my brothers and sisters..." never had such meaning as they did on the eve of Tuesday's Inauguration Day.

I don't know when else in my lifetime I have felt such patriotism and unity. The feelings, I think, have little to do with politics and individuals. It is as though a giant is waking up. All of us Americans have gone to sleep at the switch. Our wastefulness, our selfishness, and our insensitivity to others are staring us in the face through the current problems of economy, ecology, and ethics. We are all guilty. So, to borrow from another, whose words once echoed down that National Mall...

...Here on the pulse of this new day! [may you] have the grace to look up and out! And into your sister's eyes, into! Your brother's face, your country! And say simply! Very simply! With hope! Good morning
