Wednesday, March 17, is St. Patrick's Day. Much of the world will display green to celebrate the holiday. For many, a touch of green will be in clothing. An affectionate "pinch" may follow for those who forget. The Chicago River is dyed green each year for their city's celebration. Parades will be held in many cities throughout the world—in places like Argentina, South Korea, the tiny Caribbean island of Montserrat, Canada, the U.S., and of course Ireland. Last year, the White House fountain was dyed green in celebration of St. Patrick's Day.

Like many holidays, this one also has its roots in religion, originally honoring Ireland's most famous saint, Patrick. According to sketchy history, Patrick was born in Roman Britain in the late-fourth century. Kidnapped by Irish raiders at the age of sixteen, he was taken captive to Ireland as a slave. According to his confession, Patrick was guided by God in a dream to escape his captors and head to the coast to await a ship that would take him back to his homeland. Upon returning to Britain, he immediately joined the Church and began studying for the priesthood. In 1432, Patrick returned to Ireland as a bishop.

Legend has it that St. Patrick used the shamrock, a three-leaved plant, to explain the mystery of the Trinity. In Richard Rohr's new book, *The Naked Now: Learning to See as the Mystics See*, he speaks of "sweet Irish nuns" teaching him wisely of the Trinity, holding up the shamrock as a natural symbol of the three-in-one and saying, "Don't think about...just believe it."

Mystery is the sacred theme for Christ-followers, especially during the season of Lent. Much we do not understand about how *God [is] in Christ reconciling the world*, but it happens every day. We must see beyond our senses and current knowledge in order to encounter the One who calls us to be "fully alive."

The Leadership Sisters in Calcutta told of how Mother Teresa never tried to convert a Muslim or a Hindu to Christianity. She told the sisters that their job in that setting was not to talk about Jesus or even promote Jesus, but *to be Jesus!* That radical identity transforms not only ourselves, but also the world around us.

So, as you witness the world turned green Wednesday, hear music of U2, Van Morrison, and the Celtic Women, think of writers like James Joyce, F. Scott Fitzgerald, and Oscar Wilde, and remember actors and comedians like Liam Neeson, Richard Harris, and Conan O'Brien or business leaders like Peter Sutherland and David O'Reilly, remember also, that their "greenness" has its roots in the symbol of the shamrock and that Christianity's beloved hymn, "Be Thou My Vision," has its roots in Ireland.
