

Jesus is crucified.



Road to Resurrection Materials




Micro practices are small easy-to-do spiritual practices of prayer, devotion, and service. Engage with the practices when and how you can. There is no right or wrong way to do them. Do them all or only a few. Feel free to adjust the practice of the day to better fit yourself or the members of your household. TIPS: Read the daily practice in the morning so you have a chance to engage with it during the day. Set an alarm on your phone as a reminder. Review the day's practice at dinner. Note your favorite practices to make a regular part of your faith life.



Parents of Bryant Ramirez, who are living with Dawn and Bryant


I'yanna Boyd, Kelsie Hayes' niece (Kelsie is Lisa Schlickemeyer's niece)
